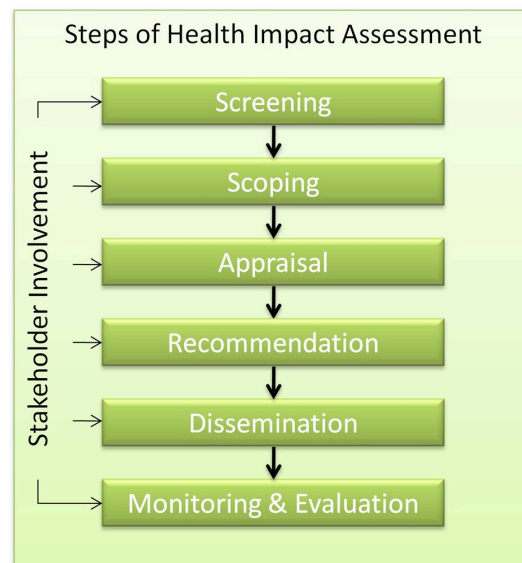


# Webinar: Health Impact Assessment – Health Equity
